7. <u>Executive Director's Report</u>

Cell phone tower contracts are up for renewal. Consulting with IDA counsel, Bob McLaughlin. One thing to note is that there is a master lease and also a separate lease for all companies currently leasing on the tower.

8. **New Business**

The Presentation by Assistant Corporation Counsel: West Street Conveyance has been rescheduled for the December 2022 Board Meeting.

Scobie Drive Update: Christopher Cooney and James McIver presented representing the project. Mr. McIver shared that DEC has stopped sharing information with him. If ground water treatment will be required it will be too costly of a requirement for both developer and the City of Newburgh. It was agreed by both sides present tonight that realistically, the needed cleanup or test info from DEC will be not available until at least April 2023. On a motion proposed by Christina Amato and seconded by Adam Pollick, it was unanimously agreed to extend the developer contract to June 30 and revisit the issue again before then.

191 Washington Street Amended Application Update: Sisha Ortuzar presented representing the project. Key financial parts of application were amended for various reasons. Contract changes and reasons include: 1) Schedule adjustments. 2) lender requirement to developer to assume higher vacancies and lower rents. 3) Increase in equity.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING A PROPOSED PROJECT TO BE UNDERTAKEN FOR THE BENEFIT OF 191 WASHINGTON STREET LLC

The following resolution was offered by Christina Amato, seconded by Adam Pollick, to wit:

WHEREAS, the City of Newburgh Industrial Development Agency (the "Agency") is authorized and empowered by the provisions of Chapter 1030 of the 1969 Laws of New York, constituting Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law, Chapter 24 of the Consolidated Laws of New York, as amended (the "Enabling Act" or the "Act") and Chapter 577 of the 1982 Laws of New York, as amended, constituting Section 913 of said General Municipal Law (said Chapter and the Enabling Act being hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Act") to promote, develop, encourage and assist in the acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, equipping and furnishing of manufacturing,

warehousing, research, commercial and industrial facilities, among others, for the purpose of promoting, attracting and developing economically sound commerce and industry to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State of New York, to improve their prosperity and standard of living, and to prevent unemployment and economic deterioration; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish its stated purposes, the Agency is authorized and empowered under the Act to acquire, construct, reconstruct and install one or more "projects" (as defined in the Act), or to cause said projects to be acquired, constructed, reconstructed and installed, and to convey said projects or to lease said projects with the obligation to purchase; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2022, 191 Washington Street LLC, a New York limited liability company, or such other person(s) or entities as may be designated by the Company and agreed upon by the Agency (collectively, the "Company"), submitted an application to the Agency, as amended by letter dated October 18, 2022 (the "Application"), a copy of which Application is on file at the office of the Agency, requesting that the Agency consider undertaking a project (the "Project") for the benefit of the Company, said Project consisting of the following: (A) the acquisition of an interest in an approximately 40,000 square foot parcel of real property located at 191 Washington Street, Newburgh, New York (the "Land"), (2) the construction and improvement of two (2) new buildings on the Land totaling approximately 70,000 square feet to consist of twelve (12) residential units and commercial space including offices and a farm brewery (the "Facility") and (3) the acquisition and installation therein and thereon of related fixtures, machinery, equipment and other tangible personal property (collectively, the "Equipment") (the Land, the Facility, and the Equipment hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Project Facility"), (B) the granting of certain "financial assistance" (within the meaning of Section 854(14) of the Act) with respect to the foregoing, including potential exemptions from certain sales and use taxes, real property taxes, real estate transfer taxes and mortgage recording taxes (collectively, the "Financial Assistance"); and (C) the lease (with an obligation to purchase) or sale of the Project Facility to the Company or such other person as may be designated by the Company and agreed upon by the Agency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 859-a of the Act, prior to the Agency providing any "financial assistance" (as defined in the Act) of more than \$100,000 to any project, the Agency, among other things, must hold a public hearing pursuant to Section 859-a of the Act with respect to said project; and

WHEREAS, the Agency desires to provide for compliance with the provisions of Section 859-a of the Act with respect to the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE CITY OF NEWBURGH INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Agency hereby authorizes the Chair, any Vice Chair or Officer of the Agency, after consultation with the members of the Agency and Agency Counsel, (A) to establish the time, date and place for a public hearing of the Agency to hear all persons interested in the Project (the "Public Hearing"); (B) to cause the Public Hearing to be held in a city, town or village where the Project Facility is or is to be located, and to cause notice of such Public Hearing to be given to the public by publishing a notice or notices of such Public Hearing in a newspaper of general circulation available to the residents of the governmental units where the Project Facility is or is to be located, such notice or notices to comply with the requirements of Section 859-a of the Act; (C) to cause notice of the Public Hearing to be given to the chief executive officer of the county and of each city, town, village and school district in which the Project Facility is or is to be located to comply with the requirements of Section 859-a of the Act; (D) to conduct or cause the holding of such Public Hearing; (E) to cause a report of the Public Hearing fairly summarizing the views presented at such Public Hearing (the "Report") to be prepared; and (F) to cause a copy of the Report to be made available to the members of the Agency.

- Section 2. The Chair, any Vice Chair and/or Officer of the Agency is hereby authorized and directed to distribute copies of this Resolution to the Company and to do such further things or perform such acts as may be necessary or convenient to implement the provisions of this Resolution.
- Section 3. All action taken by the Chair, any Vice Chair and/or Officer of the Agency in connection with the Public Hearing with respect to the Project prior to the date of this Resolution is hereby ratified and confirmed.
 - <u>Section 4</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
