6. Report from the Chair

The Chairman reported on activities of the Greater Newburgh Partnership to facilitate redevelopment of the Broadway Corridor, and the need to update Newburgh's waterfront redevelopment plans. The goal is for pedestrian friendly streets that are attractive for its residents and businesses. Steelways and City will be applying to the federal government for assistance for the development of a Port of Newburgh.

There was discussion on code enforcement policies to facilitate property clean-up for neighborhood stability.

7. Report from the Executive Director

Executive Director Teri Waivada reported she will attend the hat NYS Economic Development Council Annual meeting in May. The cost of meals and lodging will be paid by the Executive Director. She advised that Orange County Community College and Mount Saint Mary College are interested in the STARTUP NY program. A joint meeting with City and the colleges is planned. There may be a role for the IDA in the program. In addition she reported on new state mandates on reporting of sales tax abatement, recaptures of funds and project reporting. A workshop on the new procedures will be held on May 21 during the NYS EDC annual meeting.

10. New Business

Executive Director Teri Waivada advised the board of a Main Street workshop, a CPC conference, and a workshop on Historic Tax Credits. Copies will be sent to the Board via email.

11. IDA-Owned Property discussion

- 1. Based on a recommendation of the IDA's auditor and as a result of the agreement with Hudson Valley Lighting, the value of the Scobie Drive Property is devalued to \$0. (The remediation costs will exceed the value of the property.)
- 2. The IDA provided the city with documents to transfer the West Street Parking lot into a city parking lot. No action has been taken.
- West Street commercial site: Counsel will review agreements to determine existence of any reverter clauses to Northeast Development. It was agreed that property should be marketed.
- 4. Remaining residential properties and Ann Street parcel: The Executive Director will discuss potential and appropriate disposition of the remaining properties.
- 5. IDA Counsel Tom Whyatt stated that before any action is taken on a piece of property owned by the IDA that the IDA should get an appraisal done.

12. Marketing of IDA Benefits

IDA Executive Director Teri Waivada asked the board to allocate \$3,500 to design, publish, and distribute a publication detailing IDA benefits project and eligibility requirements. Note: it was suggested that the Orange County Partnership could assist in designing a brochure.

distributing a letter and informational brochure detailing the benefits of the IDA

to local businesses, real estate brokers, and attorneys

The **Federal Historic Preservation Commercial Tax Credit** and NYS Historic Commercial Tax Credit programs can be combined to cover 40% of qualified rehabilitation expenditures.

The NYS Historic Residential Properties Tax Credit Program will cover 20% of qualified rehabilitation costs of owner-occupied historic houses, up to a credit value of \$50,000. This program requires that the building be individually listed in the State or National Register of Historic Places, or in a listed historic district. The building must also be located in a qualifying census tract, and at least \$5,000 must be spent on the project.

Who Should Attend? Realtors, contractors, business and home owners, community leaders and anyone who wants to learn about new opportunities for community reinvestment.
